**A NSW Justice of the Peace
provides :**

Witness to a person making a
statutory declaration or affidavit
This involves receiving the person's
declaration, oath or affirmation that
the contents of the document are true
and correct, and witnessing the per-
son's signature on the document

Things to remember:

You must bring original
documents

Do not pre-sign your documents, they
MUST be signed in front of
the JP

There are penalties for making a false
declaration
including Imprisonment or a fine

A person who swears or affirms a
false affidavit is committing perjury, a
serious offence - punishable by law

JP's are not qualified to give
legal advise

Ruling 003
Confirming identity for NSW statutory declarations and affidavits

From 30 April 2012, before witnessing a NSW statutory declaration or affidavit, a JP must follow the instructions in "A Handbook for JPs in NSW" as well as these 3 additional steps

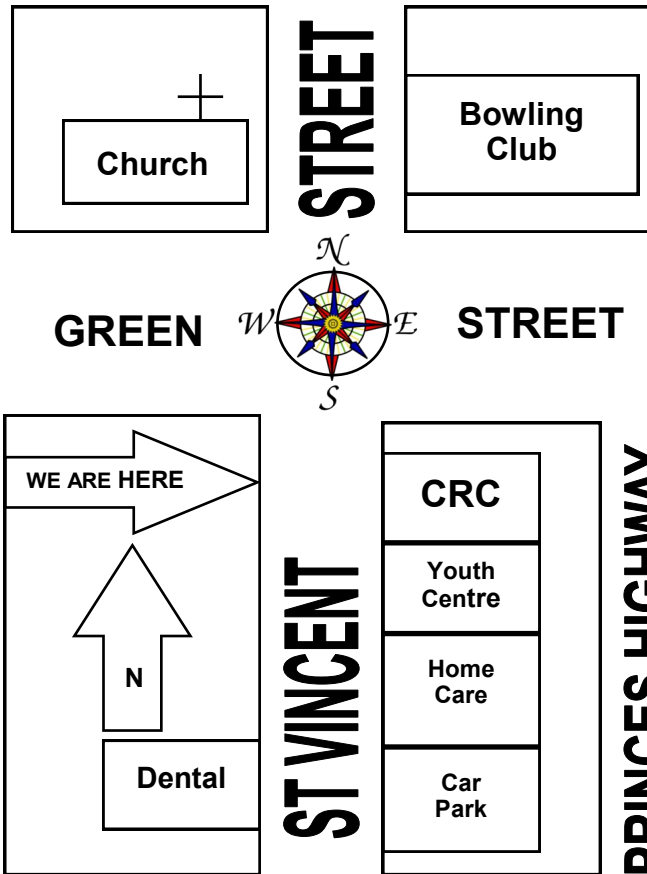
1. See the face of the person
2. Confirm the person's identity, and
3. Certify on the document that these requirements have been met.

A JP does not have to see the person's face if the JP is satisfied that the person has a 'special justification' for not removing a face covering. - a legitimate medical reason.

There are two ways to confirm identity, either: the JP has known the person for at least 12 months, or the JP has sighted an approved identification document

All new Statutory Declarations or affidavits will need to have a section for JPs to certify that identification is confirmed.
